BALVIKAS LESSON PLAN: DHARMA (DUTY AND RIGHT CONDUCT) (1)

Meaning of Dharma is rights conduct and the right way of life. It means doing your duty. Your duty can be towards people, for example your mother or your teacher. You can also have a duty to do the right thing, for example helping someone. Your duty also includes doing what you are supposed to do, so for example, if you are a student at school your duty is to do the best you can to study hard.
