

Background of Ramanomi

Sri-Ramnavami (Ramanomi) is dedicated to the memory of Lord Rama. It occurs on the ninth day (navami). The festival commemorates the birth of Rama who is remembered for his prosperous and righteous reign.

Ramraja (the reign of Rama) has become synonymous with a period of peace and prosperity.. Ramnavami occurs in the month of March. Celebrations begin with a prayer to

the Sun early in the morning. At midday, when Lord Rama is supposed to have been born, a special prayer is performed. In northern India especially, an event that draws popular participation is the Ramnavami procession. The

main attraction in this procession is a gaily decorated chariot in which four persons are dressed up as Rama, his brother Laxman, his queen Sita, and his disciple Hanuman. The chariot is accompanied by several other persons dressed up in ancient costumes as work by Rama's soldiers. The procession is a gusty affair with the participants shouting praises echoing the happy days of Rama's reign.
