Meaning

This being (God) is one. He is eternal. He is present in all things and the sustainer of all things. He is the creator of all things. He is present in his creation. He is without fear and enmity. This being is not subject to time. He is beyond birth and death. He is himself responsible for his own manifestation. (he is known) by the Guru's grace.
